But wait... when-if ever- can you get away with white glues... and not just the brands that are suitable for grade school poster projects?...And the myriad of yellow glues we so often think of as standard, now with water proofing additives... There are some more suitable (read "longer lasting") or appropriate two-part adhesives for assembling outdoor furniture. How 'bout the new Polyurethane glues? "Gorilla" glue..."the strongest glue**

known to man"... What about the pre-treatment- wetting down the surface before glue up??? the colored glues- more suitable when working with the darker hardwoods... and how about when working with teak..and some of the other exotic "oily" hardwoods? The CA adhesives - from almost "finger setting" fast to-time delayed hardening and now...gap filling and elastic compounds for special situations - Different glues for all sorts of special situations- and storage - some adhesives like being kept at "room temperature"- which doesn't include stowage in a 35-50 degree garage shop...and others that might best be kept in a corner of the fridge for long shelf life. Bob has pretty-much experienced the gamut on glues, if I can coin a phrase... and hopefully- our membership can add their own experiences to the presentation. (I recently learned there are times when the "thin" -instant CA glues make a perfectly suitable wood sealant...or "finish" ...and not just for small lathe turned projects.

Hope you'll join us- and bring your own "scary" and successful experiences in "Adhesives Night Out" at the next meeting.

We always call on a request for Show and Tell- one of the most looked forward to features of the meetings...we got some great ideas from each other...so I really encourage you to drag something in to share...or raise a question to the membership if there is an "easier way" to approach something you are pondering in the approach to better woodworking.
